

RESULTS OF THE QUESTIONNAIRE ON EVALUATION OF THE FINAL YEAR










How do you grade intercultural dialogue between students and teachers of partner countries? 5 odpowiedzi



WHAT KIND OF CHALLENGES OR DIFFICULTIES HAVE YOU ENCOUNTERED DURING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECT IN THE LAST YEAR?

- Restrictions of mobilitiest due to COVID19 situation.
- The first and most influential difficulty was the outbreak of Covid19 and the inability to organize and take part in the last mobility.
- we didn't have any difficulties. Each project activity was a big challenge for us.
- The main difficulty for all partner countries in the project was insufficient knowledge of foreign language and the difficulty of communication among pupils. Also, there was a lack of interest and motivation on the part of staff. Some of the staff were unwilling to take part in the process of the project implementation and in the mobilities to partner countries. They definitely needed a lot of effort to be convinced about possible positive impact. Finally, due to the COVID - 19 pandemic, we were unable to carry out the mobility in Lithuania.
- Motivating the students to join the activities prepared and making all the teachers feel themselves as a part of the project were challenging.

HOW DID YOU COPE WITH THEM?

- We organized several online meetings for teachers to follow the activity plan in the project and we enabled our students to take part in one online meeting with their peers from other countries as well as take part in several activities.
- We haven't had any difficulties.
- To overcome the difficulty in communication in a foreign language, English clubs were established for students which focused on the development of communicative skills. Regarding the school staff, we organized meetings to explain the content of the project and what is expected as a positive result. To raise motivation of school staff, we provided them with the benefits the project can offer: the importance for after school-clubs, good practice exchange with foreign teachers, teachers and students' social skills development as well as experience how to run the project. In order to be able to carry out the mobility in Lithuania, we requested an extension of the project for 6 months. However, the mobility didn't take place and until the end of the project we implemented distance activities and organized online meetings.
- We tried to make some meetings with our teachers and our students to show the benefits of the project. And also we try to find many different and interesting activities which may take the students` attention.
- We organized series of online meetings and activities following the project plan

PLEASE, DESCRIBE WHAT ACTIVITIES OR TASKS HAVE BEEN DONE IN YOUR SCHOOL IN THE LAST YEAR TO FULFIL THE OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT?

- Students have been provided with 16 after school clubs, School board participants were really active in the project activities: spots, creativity, robotics, ICT, music and etc. Exchange of teaching materials on distance learning and educating.
- - implementation of after school-clubs to meet students' interests: photography club, environment education club, art club, dance club, drama club, school choir club, sports club, English club, maths club, Science club, Robotics & Programming club, chess club,
 - We participated in all the activities during our preparation for each mobility.
 - we organized online meetings of the project to discuss the activities
 - we organized a competition for our students in which they were asked to prepare a presentation with their ideas illustrating the slogan "Stay home- stay motivated,"
 - On European Language Day, our students prepared a recording with greetings for our partner schools.

They also prepared a number of posters and took part in language quizzes and games.

- We organized Erasmus Days 2020 in our school preparing a presentation about our last mobility to Turkey, students who participated in the last mobility were asked questions by their schoolmates. Students also made a lot of bookmarks with motivational quotes in English.
- Our students participated in some online activities.

They filled out the Socrative quiz about the project (Erasmus+ After School Clubs) and the Kahoot Quiz (questions for all countries-partners).

Also, they participated in a task "programming in Scratch" (they created a game a cat and a mouse step by step).

- As a school we participated with our students in an online meeting in which we discussed the pros and cons of the e-Learning/ Distance leaning, the importance of participating in "Erasmus+"projects (children gave feedback on that on the Answer garden platform).

They prepared their own ideas on what participation in Erasmus+ gave them and they talked about their activities during the project.

- we prepared questionnaires about the impact of after-school clubs on students' motivation and about the acqusition of the 21st century learner
- The partner teachers filled in questionnaires and we came to some conclusions (1. Working out a common programme for combating early school leaving, 2. Evaluation of the actions taken to combat early school leaving in schools of the partnership, 3. Evaluation of the final year-final report).
- We disseminated the mobilities that took place and the results of the project.

PLEASE, DESCRIBE WHAT ACTIVITIES OR TASKS HAVE BEEN DONE IN YOUR SCHOOL IN THE LAST YEAR TO FULFIL THE OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT?

- Online meetings, School activities on different clubs, learning and work on different internet educational platforms which were new for us- Scrach, Padlet, WordWall, Answer garden, Socrative, etc.
- The activities or tasks that took place in our school in the last year to meet the project objectives are as follows: We implemented to our school after school-clubs to increase motivation and prevent school dropout. Some after school-clubs that are done in our school are: photography club, environment education club, art club, traditional dance club, drama club, reading club, school building decoration club, choirs club, club of sport activities, cooking club, English club and maths club. We participated in all the activities during our preparation for each mobility. Teachers participated in all online meetings of the project (discussions about the activities of the project). On European Language Day, our students created a puzzle and a quiz (Kahoot) and celebrated this day by playing. Also, our students created a poster for the European Day of Languages using their artistic skills and an online word art with the word "hello" in European languages!!! Our students participated in online activities. They filled out the Socrative quiz about the project (Erasmus+ After School Clubs) and the Kahoot Quiz (questions for all countries-partners). Also, they participated in a task "programming on Scratch" (they created a game a cat and a mouse step by step). We participated with our students in an online meeting. On that meeting we discussed the PRO'S and CON'S of the e-Learning/ Distance leaning, then we discussed about the importance of participating in "Erasmus+"projects (children gave feedback on that on the Answer garden platform). There was a virtual workshop on songs for the friendship, a paper work: What gave me Erasmus + programme, and of course students talked about their after school activities etc. Our students completed questionnaires and made presentations with the results of the questionnaires, coming to some conclusions (1. Impact of after-school clubs on students' motivation across school, 2. Acquisition of key competences for the 21st century learner.). The teachers filled in questionna
- Our drama club prepared a play and presented it. It was a very good experience for our students and they have all enjoyed when they see their abilities about drama. They got more self confidence, too Our art club did many examples of marbling art. They realized another meaning or the side of the school when they were interested in many different activities such as art, drama.


HOW DID YOU DISSEMINATE THE RESULTS OF THE PROJECT?


- School website, education department site, orally in Utena Education Centre methodological meetings

HOW DID YOU DISSEMINATE THE RESULTS OF THE PROJECT?


- The results of the project were disseminated in the following ways:
